Lt. Abner⁴ Curtis, Abner⁵ Jr., Ebenezer⁴ Curtis, Calvin⁴ Curtis all served briefly during the Revolution in Captain Joseph Soper's North Company marching to Marshfield at the alarm of April 19, 1775 and to Cohasset on March 5, 1776 with Capt. Lemuel³ Curtis as the Company Commander. Calvin⁴ became a Captain and served in the Massachusetts Militia during the war. Abel⁴ Curtis served in 1775 and 1776 marching to the Order for Bounty-Roxbury in 1775 and

Charles Curtis enlisted for three months in May 1775.

to Bristol, Rhode Island in 1776.

Elijah⁴ Curtis marched to the Marshfield alarm on April 19, 1775, to the Cohasset alarm of March 5, 1776, to Bristol, RI in December 1776 and to Tiverton, RI in September 1777.

Gershom⁴ Curtis marched to the Cohasset alarm of March 1776 with a company under the command of Samuel⁴ Curtis. He also served nine months during which he was under the command of Capt. Soper's company in Fishkill, NY. Gershom⁴ also was part of the expedition to Rhode Island in 1781.

Jesse⁴ Curtis marched with his cousins Abel and Abner to the Marshfield and Cohasset alarms; was with Colonel John Cushing at Point Shirley in June 1776; at Bristol, RI in December 1776;

and at Tiverton, RI in September and October 1777.

Job⁴ Curtis, Prince⁴ Curtis and Melzar⁴ Curtis all marched to the Marshfield and Cohasset alarms and to Bristol, RI in 1776.

Joseph⁵ Curtis enlisted for the summers of 1775 and 1776 marching to the Cohasset alarm and at Point Shirley in June 1776 under Nathaniel Winslow as company commander.
