#### Curtis Memorial Library, Brunswick, Maine

The Captain John Curtis Memorial Library was dedicated on December 8, 1904, when William John Curtis (b. 1854) personally presented the library, named in honor of his father, to the town of Brunswick. The website contains Curtis family materials such as the ancestry of Harold E. Curtis and the first three and four generations of the William John Curtis family. The origins of this family are not known at this time but research is currently ongoing.
