Born in 1923 and raised during the Great Depression, Vern was not a famous member of his generation, but he exemplified the characteristics that made it great. At the age of nineteen Vern went off to World War II, hoping to be a fighter pilot. Following a harrowing mid-air collision during training, he was reassigned as a waist gunner on a B-17, the most exposed member of the crew. But Vern's luck held - shortly after his crew arrived in England, VE Day occurred. Sent back to the states to join the fight against Japan, Vern got as far as Indiana when VJ Day intervened. He returned to his birthplace of Mechanicsburg, Ohio (a town the Columbus Dispatch called "the quintessential Midwestern small town") and married the former Virginia [May] Dyer. Vern went to work for the Agaloy Tubular Products Company in Springfield, Ohio, and forty years later he retired from the same company - something unheard of these days. Vern and Virginia divorced in mid-life, and he spent the rest of his life in the company of his best friend and companion, Bonnie Jordan. As a boy in Mechanicsburg, Vern dreamed of spending his life on a horse ranch in Wyoming. He never made it to Wyoming, but over the course of two decades he founded and built the Circle "C" Ranch, located northwest of Mercer, Pennsylvania, into a showplace. The Circle "C" was one of the most popular attractions on the Mercer County Farm Tour. One day on the tour a teenage girl got too close to one of Vern's horses, which bit her. Vern was terrified that a lawsuit would soon be coming his way, but the next day the family returned to the Circle "C" again; they had enjoyed the ranch so much on Saturday that they returned again on Sunday! At the age of 85, Vern sadly sold off the last of his horses and retired again, thereafter working only three or four days a week around the ranch. It seemed a simple enough life, but like so many men of his generation, Vern quietly inspired admiration and friendship. He possessed in full measure the traits that Brokaw had in mind: he took responsibility for himself, he was frugal and humble, he was a loyal friend, he worked hard and never complained. It seems unlikely that we will ever see the like of his generation again. Much about the modern world troubled and alarmed Vern, but he did his best to keep up with developments, teaching himself to use computers and emailing his friends and family right up until the end. He wrote his own

autobiography, working diligently on it for years, and his children plan to publish it privately. Vern also devoted hundreds of hours to genealogical research, a project started but abandoned many years earlier by his namesake, his Uncle Vernon Heintz. Among other interesting outcomes, the research put Vern in touch with his second cousin, Andre Heintz, a hero of the French Resistance, for whom Vern's grandson, Andre Curtis, is named. Vern will be sorely missed by the very large group of friends and family who loved him so dearly. Vern is survived by his friend, Bonnie Jordan, of Mercer; his former wife, Virginia D. Curtis, of Hermitage; four children Gregory (Simin), of Pittsburgh, Jean (Vincent), of Annville, PA., Robbin (Harry), of Masontown, PA., and Dennis (Miriam), of Glen Ellyn, IL; fifteen grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Services are private but contribution may be made in Vern's name to the Salvation Army in Sharon, PA.

1936-2010 Dr. Harvey Graham Purchase, a distinguished researcher and international expert on avian tumors, died March 12, 2010 at the age of 73. Graham was born in Livingstone, Northern Rhodesia (now Zambia) on August 8, 1936. He received the degrees of B.Sc. from the University of Witwatersrand in Johannesburg, South Africa (1955), B.V.Sc. from the University of Pretoria in Onderstepoort, South Africa (1959) and M.R.C.V.S. from the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons in London, England (1961). His father, Harvey Spurgeon Purchase, was a veterinarian, as is his brother, Iain Francis Harvey Purchase. He was employed by the USDA-ARS-Regional Poultry Research Laboratory (now Avian Disease and Oncology Laboratory) in East Lansing, MI 1961-1974 where he led a research team that developed, using the FC126 strain of turkey herpesvirus, the first vaccine against Marek's disease in the United States, a singular achievement in animal disease control and in cancer biology. He also contributed to the epidemiology of avian leukosis and was among the first to recognize the reticuloendotheliosis viruses as a distinct group of avian retroviruses. In 1965 he spent a sabbatical year with the Houghton Poultry Research Station in England, working on Marek's disease. He received M.S. and Ph.D. degrees from Michigan State University in 1965 and 1970, respectively, under the guidance of Dr. Charles Cunningham. He was a diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Microbiologists (ACVM) and a founding diplomate of the American College of Poultry Veterinarians (ACPV). He was also an active member of the American Association of Avian Pathologists (AAAP) and the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA). Among his roles with the AAAP, he served on the editorial committee for the first 2 editions of Isolation and Identification of Avian Pathogens, and was the chairman of the editorial committee for the 3rd edition. With Simon Shane, he championed the concept

of a specialty board certification for poultry veterinarians, an effort that resulted in the necessary support from the AAAP board to pave the way for the formation of the ACPV. He was active in the ACVM, serving as Executive Director and Secretary/Treasurer. He served on the AVMA Advisory Board of Veterinary Specialties. From 1974-1988 he worked for the USDA Agricultural Research Service in Beltsville, MD. holding several posts with the National Program Staff including a period as Assistant Administrator. He also served as Scientific Advisor to the Director of the Beltsville Research Center. From 1988-1998 he was Director of Research at the Mississippi State University College of Veterinary Medicine, where he received the Dean's Pegasus Award, and Associate Director of the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station. From 1998-2000 he was Chief of the Pennsylvania Veterinary Laboratory in Harrisburg, PA. Since his retirement in He received numerous awards including the Tom Newman Award, the 2000 he lived in Dagsboro, DE. Arthur Fleming Award, the USDA Distinguished Service Award, the CPC International Award and the Sigma Xi Junior Research Award. He was active in Boy Scouts and was a volunteer for the Delaware Center for the Inland Bays. His lifelong hobbies included fishing, square dancing, sailing and singing in his church choir.
