

Her <u>father was Arthur Darby Curtiss and mother Lata LaVesta Launder</u>. Her father was a florist who did landscaping work and worked in greenhouses. Helen was the third child with two older sisters, Ethelyne N. Drake and Ruby L. Grandfield, both now deceased. In the early 1920s the family moved to Los Angeles and lived on Idaho Avenue. In 1924 Helen's brother Edward H. was born. Ed would go onto marry Helen Curtiss – two Helens, and the sisters- in-law were very close friends. Sadly, Arthur Curtiss never knew his son because Arthur was in the hospital from early 1924 to mid 1925, when he died. Helen was 12 years old. In 1929 Ethelyne married Elvin "Ducky" Drake who was a beloved figure in UCLA athletics for his entire career – Drake Stadium was later named after him, and the players loved him. Ducky and friend John Wooden were around quite a bit. Everyone had a nickname in this family. Ruby was called "Sis"; Lauren, Ruby's

husband, was called "Red"; you heard about "Ducky"; Ed was and is called "Bud"; of course there was "Babe". Babe graduated from University High School. She was in its first graduating class. She was extremely social and had some wonderful friends. They started a high school philanthropy club called Cosmos. She graduated right around the time of the Great Depression, and after graduation, Helen worked at the Tivoli Theater on Santa Monica Blvd for 25 cents per day. She met her husband John Wesley Conner who of course had a nickname – he was called "Wes" - and they were married in 1931. Both ended up working for Tucker McClure, Corporation which was a General Contracting business. Wes was an electrician and Helen was an excellent secretary who was an expert in short hand. During this time, even though World War II had not started yet, Tucker McClure was building military bases, and there was a lot of military activity going on in Ecuador. Helen and Wes transferred to the jungles of Ecuador around 1933 and they would live there for almost a decade. Interestingly enough, the doctors had told them they would not be able to have children, and for quite some time they didn't. But in 1943 they decided to leave Ecuador to have their first child, John, here in the United States. Helen was VERY pregnant. On the way home from Ecuador, their plane actually crashed in Mexico because of a landing gear failure. Amazingly, no one was hurt, but there was still this little matter of getting to Los Angeles to have their baby. Fortunately, they got here just in time. Wes and Helen ended up having two children – John Arthur born in 1943 and David O. born about a year and half later. The doctors were wrong. John is married to Patricia Johnson and David is married to Jill Fry. While back in Los Angeles, Helen continued working for Tucker McClure as executive secretary. She used to ride the red car trolley from Venice Blvd to downtown LA, where she handled the company payroll. She always made sure her kids had their lunches packed before school, and would send the kids to school before she headed off to work. In 1960 Tucker McClure the owner of the business, passed away, and his son Allan took over. Allan ended up closing down the business and Helen helped with that process. Allan was also really into astronomy, and Helen helped him get some of his work published. He gave Helen and Wes a telescope, and this became one of her hobbies and interests. However, the closing of the business meant Helen needed a new job, and so she became the executive secretary for the California State University Chancellor's Office, from 1960 to 1974. She worked for the President of the Council. She finally retired in 1974, age 62. She and Wes's life in retirement was extremely enjoyable. She had a lot of friends, and she was still friends with some people from Uni High School, in fact the Cosmos philanthropy club kept going up until the 1970s. They met once a month. She and Wes were also involved in a club called the Huff and Puffs which was a square dancing club. They were part of a poker club, and she was a member of the philanthropy club called PEO International. Helen and Wes traveled all over the world including Germany, England, Australia, Ireland, they even went to China in the 1970s which was pretty much unheard of. Their favorite place was Italy. They were both healthy and able to enjoy clubs, social events and they loved having the family, including their sons, daughters-in-law, and granddaughters Samantha, Cassandra, and Alexandra, and extended family over for family dinners. Babe hosted nearly every wedding shower, baby shower, anniversary party and many birthdays for the family. They were blessed with good health and a fun retirement together which they enjoyed until the 1990s, when Wes Conner died in 1994 at age 87. Helen was a member of the West LA Methodist Church on Butler Ave, then University Bible Church on Wilshire Blvd. In the few years I knew her, she asked me to call her Helen, I think she thought it wasn't good for the pastor to call her Babe. The biggest spiritual influence in her life was Community Bible Study. Helen Curtiss first invited Babe to join in the late 1970s, and she really enjoyed it. Over time, her understanding of the Bible grew and she began talking more and more about the Lord Jesus as her Savior. She was faithful in doing her lessons and homework. After a while, she was asked to serve in the leadership group, as Dottie Larson's transcriber in shorthand, which she did even into her 90s. She would type up her notes and send them to Dottie, and those teachings would end up all over the country. Babe loved the women of CBS and it made a huge impact on her life. The other CBS women really loved her, too. In her last years, Helen was eager to go be with the Lord in heaven. Sometimes she would wake up in the morning and say "Oh darn, I'm still here." She had no doubts about where she would spend eternity, not because she was a good person but because she had faith in God's Word, that whoever truly calls upon and believes in the Lord Jesus Christ will be saved. Well, she's finally there. Her Memorial Celebration was help at the Woodlawn Cemetery in Santa Monica, California May 28, 2014."

Curtiss, John A. (c1925-2014) (Tampa Tribune) (11/7/2014)

Tampa Lawyer never flaunted WWII heroism. Longtime resident won Distinguished Service Cross, dies at age 89. - TAMPA - John A. Curtiss was a Harvard Law School graduate and a successful lawyer in Tampa for many decades. He was generally regarded as quiet. He also was a war hero, but almost nobody knew it. During World War II, Curtiss was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, the second highest military award, behind only the Medal of Honor, for charging a machine gun nest in the Philippines. Racing across 25 yards of open ground, he was hit in the neck and hands but reached the machine gun, which he then turned on his attackers, killing several. He was 19. He had already been wounded once in the war. "No one knew," said his son-in-law Patrick Shea, who delivered the eulogy this week at the funeral for Curtiss, who died Nov. 1 at age 89. "Even his closest friends never knew about it. Even when his children asked him, he never talked about that. He just was that type of person."The memories probably weren't easy. Here's a description, taken from a U.S. Army document, detailing Curtiss' part in the fierce jungle firefight in October 1944: "In the face of great danger, Curtiss bore down on the enemy. When he killed one ... at the gun, the remainder turned and fled. Quickly, Curtiss whirled the enemy machine gun around, turning it on the retreating (enemy). Opening fire, he killed several more of the enemy. "Inspired by his example, his comrades charged, inflicting many casualties and completely routed the enemy. Private Curtiss remained at his gun, delivering heavy fire until all the enemy in the position had been killed." Curtiss' actions during the Battle of Leyte in the Philippines in the fall of 1944 were recognized by the Army, which promoted him to sergeant and awarded him the honor. Curtiss was with the 32nd Infantry Division that saw considerable action during the war in the Pacific, and Leyte was his third engagement. "It would have probably been a Medal of Honor, if he had died," Shea said. "Of course, we're all satisfied with the Distinguished Service Cross." John Curtiss left the Army in late 1945, returned to his home

state of Maryland, where he attended college, then eventually to Harvard Law School before moving to Tampa. He took a job practicing business law with Macfarlane, Ferguson, Allison and Kelly in Tampa. Charles W. Pittman was a colleague of Curtiss at the law firm. "Yes," he said, "I was vaguely aware of it," Pittman said, referring to the Distinguished Service Cross. "But he never talked about it, not to me, anyway. We were law partners for a number of years. "I had conversations with him from time to time," Pittman said. "His hearing was bad, I think a bomb or shell had exploded near him and damaged his hearing. "He was quiet," his former colleague said, "reserved." Curtiss' son, Mark, said the family largely was unaware of his father's heroic actions during the war. He said he learned about the significance of the Distinguished Service Cross from old newspaper stories about his dad. "He really didn't speak of it openly very often," Mark Curtiss said. "Once in a while you could drag a story or two out of him." Years ago, the family went to see "Saving Private Ryan," the graphic portrayal of World War II combat in Europe. "My dad walked out of it," Mark Curtiss said. "I guess it brought back too many memories." It was then Stuart decided to return to Kansas State University where he completed both his Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees in Industrial Engineering and met and married his wife and lifelong partner, Janie, After graduation, he came back to the family machine shop that was providing precision machined aircraft parts (using the customer's blueprints) for various manufacturers that were supporting the Korean War effort. Stuart immediately decided "...we need a product line so we have work to do every week of the year and we need to machine from our own engineering drawings". With that in mind, he whipped out his slide rule (no laptop computers back in those days) and designed the gears we still use today in Curtis Machine's products. Stuart's gear and gearbox designs have been copied by several companies throughout the world. He founded a new corporation and grew it totally from the ground up. There was no engineering department and there were no part numbers so he developed our current part numbering system with easy-to-identify part numbers. He then designed our standard line of gearboxes and implemented our unique "straddle mounted bearings" design. This engineering design is one of the reasons that Curtis Machine is the largest manufacturer of right angle and off-angle bevel gear boxes (in our torque range) throughout the world. Curtis Machine was the first company in Dodge City (except for the gas company) to have a computer. The old IBM model 360 took up a lot of space and required the room it was in to be temperature controlled. Several people worked in this department that used punched cards for data entry. Stuart used the Fortran and hexadecimal engineering knowledge that he learned during his Kansas State years to completely program this new computer. The software Stuart wrote specifically for Curtis Machine has never been equaled by IBM or anyone else. Time passed and in 1994 news came that Stuart had been chosen by Kansas State University to receive the Distinguished Service Award from the College of Engineering. In 2012, Kansas State University inducted Stuart into its Engineering Hall of Fame.. Stuart, with his wife, Janie, moved to Marco Island, Florida in the year 2000. Stuart was very proud that he was a Past Commodore of the Marco Island Yacht Club as well as a Certified U.S. Coast Guard Captain. He loved Janie, his wife of 51 years, and his son, John and his wife, Jenny. Stuart passed away on Sunday, June 22, 2014 with his devoted wife Janie standing at his side [edited because of length]

The belief that Thomas(1) came from Appledore is wide spread and quoted in most sources. However, Thomas(1) parentage or birth place has never been proven. The article 'The Puzzling Family Origins of Thomas Curtis of Wethersfield' by Mary Curtis Perry as printed in the Connecticut Nutmegger, Vol 25, p. 192-198 from 1992 (free on-line through NEHGS), suggests "Some of the circumstantial evidence in England and later in America suggests that Thomas Curtis of Wethersfield may have descended from the Curtis Family of Nazeing, Essex." However, DNA evidence by Al Field, DNA Curtis/s Family Coordinator, concludes that (1) "Henry of Sudbury was a relative of Thomas of Wethersfield with an unknown common ancestor, and that (2) together they are genetically unique and unrelated to the descendants of the other Curtis families in the DNA project. They are "members of the R1a1 haplogroup, often characterized as being of Viking descent. Thomas of Wethersfield is not connected to the Appledore, Kent line, or with any other known Curtis family "during the last 10 to 20 thousand years."

He comments: "for the Curtis clan of Scituate, the birth date and place of Thomas Curtis who died Ash, Kent Co, England 1631 has never been determined. The Folkstone connection resulted by a comment made by Harold E Curtis that he had found a Curtis family in Folkstone that had a Thomas baptized 1574 and siblings with the same names as Thomas' surviving sons - John, Richard & William. Most of us researchers of that family do not believe the Folkstone connection. The TMG database probably needs to reflect the possibility but that there is nothing documented. Thomas and first wife Bennett's marriage entry in the St Nicholas Church (Ash) registry states Thomas & Bennett were of "this parish."]
